The cost of post closure monitoring and maintenance has also been recalculated. Therefore, these recalculated amounts, rather than an inflation adjustment for calendar year 2007, have been used to establish the Annual Fund Contribution.

Pine Tree Landfill, Hampden, Maine

Dear Tom:

As requested, Sevee & Maher Engineers, Inc. (SME) has updated our opinion of closure and post-closure costs for the Pine Tree Landfill (PTL) in Hampden, Maine for the calendar year 2007. The closure costs include monies to place a final cover over Secure III Expansion areas which have been constructed but not received final cover as of the December of 2008. These include Phase VI, Phase VIII-C Stages 1 & 2, which encompasses 31.7 acres<sup>1</sup>. Our opinion of the costs to construct a final cover over these 31.7 acres is \$7,635,000. Note the construction of the final cover on Phase VII and Phase VIII-C Stage 3 will be constructed beginning in May of 2008 and is scheduled to be complete by the September of 2008. Our opinion of the closure costs is based on per-acre closure costs presented in Table 1 for the 31.7 acres of the landfill which will not have received final cover as of December of 2008. These costs were developed from competitive bids to construct the final cover over Phases VII and VIII-C Stage 3 obtained in March of 2008.

The post-closure costs and maintenance costs for the entire facility are presented in Table 2. These costs include post-closure monitoring and maintenance of the site as summarized in Table 2. These costs include monitoring and maintenance, including leachate and gas handling for entire closed area described above, as well as post-closure monitoring and maintenance costs for the current Conventional Landfill, Secure I and

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

Secure II and Secure II Landfills. The post-closure costs assume a 30-year post-closure period. The post-closure costs also include leachate, groundwater, and landfill gas collection and treatment costs. The cost to collect and treat the groundwater is from the site perimeter drain and extraction wells that are part of the site corrective action plan. The post-closure costs are presented on a yearly basis in 2008 dollars.

Dear Ms. Lessard

I've lived in Hampden for two years, and here-to-fore I have tried to assimilate myself into this community without comment or complaint. However I have three complaints and I'm going to express them. I will also offer solutions to two of them.

ONE... The other day when I went to the town office to purchase a refrigeration unit dump sticker I couldn't do it because I didn't have sufficient cash with me and a sign on the door says the town doesn't accept credit card or credit card payments. I had to make a second trip to the town office to buy the sticker, which was both inconvenient and, gas wise, expensive. This is the first time in a long time that I was unable to use a debit card at a place of business. Using a debit card has become a standard American way to make purchases and pay fees. This is 2008 and the Town of Hampden isn't a sidewalk lemonade stand. What gives? Let me answer my own question. I can only assume that the town doesn't want to buy or lease a card reader and pay transactions fees. I have lived in a number of states over the years and the tax rate in Hampden is easily the highest I have incurred. What am I getting for my money?

SOLUTION... For service to and for the convenience of its residents the Town of Hampden can afford to lease or purchase a card reader and pay the transaction fees without further raising taxes.

TWO... Eventually I returned to the town office and paid cash for a refrigeration unit dump sticker. When I inquired of the lady who sold me the sticker why the fee was being charged I got what is, no doubt, the town line. She said it was because Hampden is the only place in the area that collects and disposes, but doesn't charge for refrigeration units. That's why folks from all over the area take their refrigerators to the Hampden dump. She said the number of illegally dumped refrigeration units is very high, much higher than those dumped by town residents with stickers. She said the cost to the town for disposal of a refrigeration unit is \$15, the same as the sticker. She said the fee is to prevent those other people from using the Hampden Dump to dump refrigeration units. Essentially this is the same information you gave in your letter of April 18, 2008 to the residents of Hampden. Lets see, by that logic Hampden residents who pay for the town dump with property taxes have to pay an additional fee to dump refrigeration units just to


prevent non residents from dumping their refrigeration units illegally. That is unfair and as I will illustrate, unnecessary as well.

SOLUTION... I understand completely that the periodic \$5.00 charge for a town dump sticker pays for the sticker only, if that, and the cost of operating the town dump comes from property taxes. The purpose of the sticker, no doubt, is to allow entrance to the dump by Hampden residents only. However, up until very recently no one at the dump had ever checked my truck to see if I had a sticker. It's no wonder that the Hampden town dump gets "dumped" on. During the last month or so there have been folks checking my sticker every time I enter the gate, sometimes one fellow, sometimes two. I'm not sure why it would take two but in any event checking stickers at the gate should keep illegal dumping of all sorts of trash not just refrigeration units to a minimum. Eliminating illegal dumping should in turn eliminate the cost of disposing of the high number of illegally dumped refrigeration units and other materials as well. Those savings should be sufficient to pay for the additional gate personnel now in place at the dump or pay for a motorized gate activated by a bar code sticker system, both of which make the refrigeration unit dump fee unnecessary. One of the solutions to the problem is already in place and another one should be looked into if it hasn't already.

THREE... In your letter you made mention of the restricted dates and times for dumping what you describe as "waste streams", but you didn't explain why. Try as I might I can't figure out why any acceptable trash can't be dumped whenever the dump is open. Someone will have to explain that one to me.

Finally, in your letter you observed that the town's transfer station is a popular and practical waste collection facility. I will submit that it is neither. To repeat my earlier statement, this is 2008 and the Town of Hampden isn't a roadside lemonade stand. This is an upscale community, which as the new housing tracts illustrate, is becoming more so all the time. Residential trash pickup is a service this berg needs to incorporate.

Dear Mr. Lerch,

The purpose of this letter is to respond to yours regarding issues related to debit/credit card acceptance by the Town, the separate need to purchase disposal stickers for appliances with refrigerants, and general transfer station operation. Thank you for taking the time to express your concerns in writing. I would have been happy to discuss them with you in person when you were in to purchase the sticker for the refrigerator since I know that the staff person who waited on you afforded you the opportunity.

First, the debit/credit card discussion. The idea of taxes absorbing the costs of creating a convenience for credit/debit card use is one that has been debated on a number of occasions by the Hampden Town Council, whose job it is to set such policies for the town. In order to offer this service without recovering the fees charged, the Town would have to raise tax dollars to cover the charges. For excise tax alone, the Town of Hampden collects nearly \$1.5 million dollars. If half the people paid via credit card with a 3% charge to the town - we would need to raise an additional \$22,500 to cover that shortfall. In a similar vein, property taxes assessed in the community amount to approximately 8 million dollars, credit card use to pay half of those taxes would require raising \$120,000 to cover the costs. Funds raised and appropriated by the community are for specific purposes and these would be no different. The \$152,500 would have to be a line item in the budget and paid by all - not just by those who want the convenience of using a credit card. We are, however, investigating the use of debit cards with a program available through our current bank that would assess any transaction costs to the consumer rather than move them onto other residents.

Your second concern was in regard to the \$15 fee for refrigerant-containing appliances. The fee for disposal of appliances with refrigerants at the transfer station is being done for several reasons. One is to discourage their disposal here from places other than Hampden. Even though we are checking to make sure that all who use the facility are legitimate Hampden residents, that does not prevent residents from bringing refrigerators from friends and relatives who live in other communities who either do not accept them or who charge for them. The second is to cover the \$15 charge that the Town pays for disposal of

each refrigerator and certification as required by law that the refrigerant has been appropriately removed from it. The Council made the policy for this fee only since all other appliances are taken at no charge to the community for disposal.

Your third concern related to the limitation of disposal of certain waste streams (wood, construction and demolition debris, metal, shingles, etc.) to two weekends per month. The restructuring of the Transfer Station operation has taken place in an effort to control access by non-residents, and to more cost-effectively manage it while still affording residents a local option for disposal of more than just the solid waste (household trash) and recyclables that the law mandates the Town to handle. Many communities require their residents to find their own solution to construction and demolition debris and brush and metal and such materials, or they limit collection - as do Bangor and Brewer - to two times per year. Clean up of the transfer station and hauling away collected materials twice per month instead of after every weekend reduces the tax dollars needed to run the operation. Since only about 20% of eligible residents actually deposit wood, brush, construction demo, shingles, or metal on a regular basis at the facility, leaving its operation at 'anything/anytime' drove costs unnecessarily for the majority of people who pay the costs of its operation, which had escalated to over half a million dollars a year.


Finally, as you noted we are not a 'roadside lemonade stand' nor, I would offer, are we a 'berg'. The idea of curbside pickup of trash is an idea that has been discussed by the Town Council and which was put out to a referendum vote by the residents of the Community approximately ten years ago - where it was defeated by a three to one voting margin. The residents of the community made it clear that they did not want curbside pickup and that they preferred the Transfer Station instead. My comment regarding the 'popularity' of the Transfer Station is based on voter approval - not conjecture. And to set the record straight on the number of employees checking stickers - we have one person who was hired to do that at the gate. The other person that you have seen at the facility with the list is the Public Works Director who is paid on salary - not per hour. He was there on the first two weekends since the change was made in order to answer questions and insure that the operation ran smoothly.

Although Hampden has the reputation of being 'upscale', there are many in the community for whom the deteriorating economy, erosion in investment value, job loss, and fixed incomes make paying the bills more difficult every year. Of our current \$15.70 mil rate, \$10.21 cents goes to pay education costs to SAD #22, \$1.00 goes to pay the County Tax to Penobscot County, and the remaining \$4.49 pays for the municipal services which include police, fire, public works, transfer station, buildings and grounds, street lights, recreation programs, the pool operation, the library, etc. As we move forward, it is the goal of the

Council to make sure that municipal services are provided in as cost effective manner as possible. The Transfer Station was an obvious area of abuses and unnecessary expenses.

As I stated at the beginning of this letter, I would be happy to discuss these items and any other concerns that you may have in person.
